2012 Summer Art Camp Community Scholarships

The Dunedin Fine Art Center is proud to once again offer scholarships for the 2012 art enrichment summer camps. In the past, community partners such as *The City of Dunedin, Dunedin Rotary, Dunedin Rotary North, the Employees of the Tampa Bay Times, Pinellas Cultural Foundation, Inc, the Pinellas Community Foundation, many individuals and organizations* have granted funds to be used for this purpose.

To apply for a scholarship, DFAC needs the following items for documentation:

1. Letter from the parent as to why a scholarship is needed.
2. Drawing or letter from child as to why they would like to come to art camp.
3. Copy of a report card showing satisfactory grades.
4. Letter of recommendation from art teacher.
5. (City of Dunedin scholarship only).
Proof of Dunedin residency

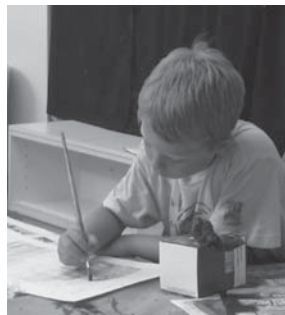
Sizzlin' Summer Visual Art Camp



The visual arts camp exposes students to a variety of media, techniques, art history, and multicultural appreciation in a fun and educational environment. Each week there are **four daily classes** grouped by age for 6 (completed kindergarten) – 10 year olds. **Working with the theme of the week**, the students rotate through **drawing/painting, 3D Art, Hands On Museum, and Clay** for an hour per class per day.

Mural Madness Art Camp



Under the direction of DFAC's wonderful faculty, young artists will learn the steps in creating magnificent, monumental sized drawings and paintings that will be on display at DFAC. Students will work as a **team** or in **teams of smaller groups** using the **theme of the week**, to work up **sketches**, then **scaled drawings**, then **transferring/enlarging their artwork onto huge sections of paper**.

This camp gives young artists the chance to **create theatre from the ground up!** Participants explore performance through **creative games and exercises**, working together as an ensemble to produce an **original piece complete with song and dance**. With tryouts, daily parts development and daily practice, campers learn the value of their own ideas and abilities as well as effective physical and vocal techniques. Each week of themed dramatics culminates in a **celebratory performance showcasing campers' diligence and ingenuity**.

Inspiration for each week's theme development will come from instructors, young actors' imaginations, books/stories, Broadway Plays, movies and TV shows/cartoons/animations.
