



CLASSES

Standard DFAC classes run for six week sessions. Session dates are on the cover and on the bottom of every other page.

Each class meets once a week, on the designated day and time listed under the class code and title. All classes are held at DFAC's main campus, unless otherwise noted.

Tuition listed is for the entire session based upon member (M) or non-member (NM) rates.

DFAC's class **skill level** sets range from *Level 1* (beginner, with no prior experience); *Levels 2,3,4* (intermediate with basic to advanced skill levels) to *Level 5* (professional artist).

Some classes have a materials fee, and/or lab fee. This fee covers the entire session.

James McNeill Whistler (1834-1903), the expatriate American artist, was one of the most colorful and controversial figures in Victorian England. As an outspoken proponent of the new radical "art for art's sake" philosophy, Whistler was also one of the first artists to create strikingly "modernist" paintings inspired by that philosophy." Art for Art's Sake" was the antiestablishment belief that art had intrinsic beauty and value and, as such, should be divorced from traditional narrative, didactic, or storytelling functions. Whistler's now iconic 1871 painting of his mother—properly titled Arrangement in Grey and Black No 1—was actually his first major effort to make a painting that demonstrated that philosophy.

Dee's program offers an entertaining account of Whistler's genius, his turbulent career, and his extraordinary achievements as a pioneer Modernist painter in Victorian England.

Speaker Dee (Dolores) Kilgo, Ph.D., is Professor Emeritus of Art History, Illinois State University. Recipient of NEA and Smithsonian Fellowships, she has authored 3 books, a PBS documentary, and many articles on 19th century art and photography.

"if you don't see a class that fits your schedule, a class may be created for at least 6 participants and contingent on studio/instructor availability."


Note: These are drop off programs (except family classes). This means that the children's classes and teen classes are for their respective ages and not for adults/parents. This allows parents to "take a break".


