AWARD GUIDELINES

The Sterling Society of the Dunedin Fine Art Center presents the application for the 2022 "Patron of the Arts" annual award. This award is to recognize and acknowledge those who have demonstrated outstanding achievement and support of the arts and the Dunedin Fine Art Center. This individual must have an ongoing history of support of the arts and contributions to the overall quality of cultural life.

WHO MAY SUBMIT A NOMINATION?

Anyone may submit a nomination and the nominator may propose more than one individual to be considered on separate application forms.

NOMINATION PROCESS

A narrative, describing the nominee's accomplishments in two pages or less, must accompany each typed nomination form. The nominator should use his/her own words to explain why they think the nominee should receive an award. Include such information as:

- Examples of support, including innovative or creative events, programs or materials that reflect the efforts of the nominee
- Leadership examples and initiatives within the Dunedin arts community
- Other details regarding the impact and benefits resulting from the nominee's contributions
