

There are designated disabled parking spaces near the entry and there is easy access to and throughout the Center and Palm Cafe. DFAC is a handicapped accessible facility.

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



PT368 Introduction to Japanese Sumi-e

With Noriko Kuehn Mondays, 6 Week Class 1:00 PM - 3:00 PM Tuition: \$180 All Levels welcome! Offered Summer I, Fall I

Discover the serene artistry of Sumi-e, the traditional Japanese art of ink painting. In this course, students will learn the fundamental techniques of this meditative art form that captures the essence of subjects with minimal, fluid brushstrokes. We begin by exploring proper brush handling, ink preparation, and essential brushstrokes known as the Four Gentlemen: bamboo, orchid, chrysanthemum, and plum blossom. These classical subjects help develop the precise brush control and confidence needed for more complex compositions. Throughout the course, students will learn to appreciate the vital role of negative space, the importance of gesture and movement, and how to achieve varying tonal qualities with ink. We'll also explore the philosophical aspects of Sumi-e, including the concept of capturing the spirit (qi) of a subject rather than creating a literal representation. Weekly demonstrations and hands-on practice will build toward creating complete compositions. By the end of the course, students will have developed the basic skills to create their own Sumi-e paintings and understand the principles that guide this elegant art form. No prior artistic experience is necessary. Supply List: A \$20 fee is paid directly to the instructor to cover cost of Sumi Ink, Japanese brush & some paper which the student keeps.



PT371 Advanced Japanese Sumi-e: Mastering Spirit and Form

This advanced Sumi-e course delves deep into the sophisticated techniques and philosophical underpinnings of Japanese ink painting. Designed for experienced Sumi-e practitioners who have mastered the fundamental techniques, this intensive course pushes the boundaries of traditional practice while honoring its core principles. Students will explore complex subjects including dynamic landscapes (sansuiga), birds in flight, human figures, and abstract expressions of natural phenomena such as wind and rain. Special attention will be given to composition (configuration), particularly the interplay between powerful focal points and subtle supporting elements that create compelling visual narratives. Prerequisites: Completion of Intermediate Sumi-e or equivalent experience. Portfolio review may be required by instructor. Supply List: A \$20 fee is paid directly to the instructor to cover cost of Sumi Ink, Japanese brush & some paper which the student keeps.

AW115 Art Social Studio

We will cover the preparation, use, and care of both straight and oblique dip pens, nibs, and other necessary tools. No experience, training, or artistic skills required. W-CG212 Copperplate Calligraphy

With Margot Griffin 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM Tuition: \$75 Level: Intermediate Offered: NOV 5

This intermediate level calligraphy course assumes prior knowledge of how to use a dip pen with a pointed nib, though students may also use a brush marker if preferred. Copperplate is a lovely, traditional hand that stems from English Roundhand and was popular in the 18th and 19th centuries. The contrast between elegant hairlines and gentle swells will take your calligraphy to a more formal level while preserving legibility. This hand-on class will use black or brown inks that may stain clothing.

W-CG110 Broad Edge Scripts

With Margot Griffin 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM Tuition \$70 Levels: Intermediate, Advanced, Professional Offered: NOV 19

This workshop is a follow up to the introductory course and students should be familiar with how to use a broad edged nib to create curved strokes. We will learn how to properly lay out a hand and examine the differences between Italic, Roman, and Gothic miniscules. A comparison of selected majuscules will follow. Our goal will be to produce a simple quote on card stock.

W-CG111 Watercolor Garden Level II

With Margot Griffin 6:30 PM - 8:30 PM Tuition: \$75 Levels: Intermediate, Advanced, Professional Offered: DEC 3

Students in this class will build on the floral painting skills they learned in the introductory workshop, starting with more complicated flowers and moving onto full page compositions. A general knowledge of how to use water color paints and some practice with variable pressure techniques is a good base for this class. All materials will be provided but feel free to supplement with your own supplies.



CL610 Throwing on the Wheel II

With Ira Burhans Tuesdays, 6 Week Class 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM Tuition: \$215 Clay Fee: \$25 Lab Fee: \$20 Levels: Advanced, Professional Offered: Fall II

This class is for the student who has some experience on the potter's wheel. Students will work with the instructor to better understand different throwing techniques and work on their own ideas in class. Together we will explore the never-ending challenge and discovery of working in clay. Ages 17 and up.

CL623 Learning to Throw

With Lee Anderson Tuesdays, 6 Week Class 6:00 PM - 9:00 PM Tuition: \$215 Clay Fee: \$25 Lab Fee: \$20 Levels: Beginner, Intermediate Offered: Summer I, Summer II, Fall I, Fall II

This work-at-your-own-pace class covers the basic mechanics of throwing on the wheel, including preparing the clay, centering, shaping, trimming, and glazing. We also discuss firing techniques, including raku. The focus of the class is on practicing techniques, and students include those who have never worked with clay to those who are more advanced. Ages 17 and up.

CL604 Clay FUN-damentals

With Lee Anderson Thursdays, 6 Week Class 6:00 PM - 9:00 PM Tuition: \$215 Clay Fee: \$25 Lab Fee: \$20 All Levels Welcome! Offered: Summer I, Summer II, Fall I, Fall II,

Explore clay at your own pace in a relaxed atmosphere. Learn basic pottery skills, practice skills you already have learned, or try something new. Hand building and wheel techniques will be demonstrated as well as various surface treatments and firing techniques. Learn the basic do's and dont's of working in clay and from there, your imagination is the limit. Ages 17 and up.



CL644 Exploring Forms

With Glenn Woods Mondays, 6 Week Class 6:00 PM - 9:00 PM Tuition: \$215 \$20 Lab fee \$25 Clay fee Intermediate Advanced Offered: Fall II

This class is open to intermediate and advanced students who want to explore forms of their choice. I encourage you to bring photos or sketches of forms you wish to explore and we can go from there. Weeks 1 through 4 will be dedicated to throwing, trimming, and preparing your pieces for the glaze night, which will be on week 5. The glazes we will use in this class will be crystalline glazes. We will discuss methods of glaze application and preparing your bisque pieces for the crystalline glaze firing, we will also go over firing schedules and what happens during the firing at the various temperatures we use to grow the crystals. Week 5 will be dedicated to glazing and loading the kiln. Week 6 will be dedicated to removing the crystalline pieces from their risers and finishing the bottoms with diamond grinding discs. This session will conclude with a critique and discussion session reviewing glaze results - what worked well and what we should avoid in the future.

CL112 Let's Play With Clay

With Sondra Elder Wednesdays, 6 Week Class 1:00 PM - 4:00 PM Tuition: \$215 (6 Week) \$180 (5 Week) Clay Fee: \$25 Lab Fee: \$20 All Levels Welcome! Offered Summer II (5 Week), Fall I, Fall II (5 Week)

Students will learn to bring the clay to life using techniques appropriate for their form and style. While most demonstrations will be done on the wheel, hand-builders are always welcome and will benefit tremendously from the demonstrations. Students may also work on their own independent projects. Intermediate and advanced students will learn refining techniques to help give their work a more professional look and feel. We will also cover preparation of the pieces for glaze firing - including CRYSTALLINE GLAZING. Of course, studio glazes and underglazes are always available. Students may also learn techniques for spraying colors, that are not normally achieved in high-fire oxidation, onto their work. Everyone is welcome to come have fun and create with us. Ages 17 and up.



CL634 Clay Exploration

There will be weekly demonstrations that will cover multi-pieced construction, darting, carving, and more. We will make amazing planters, mugs, bowls, lamps and so much more. If time permits, we will even cover how to make two piece press molds out of plaster. Join me for this fun and innovative class!

CL639 Surface Decoration Techniques For Pottery

With Maryann Charmoz Wednesdays, 6 Week Class (4 Week class Summer II) 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM Tuition: \$215 (\$145 Summer II) Clay Fee: \$25 Lab Fee: \$20 All Levels Welcome! Offered: Summer II (4 Week) Fall I, Fall II

This course will cover several techniques for decorating pottery. We will cover modern day Majolica, stenciling, painting with underglazes, wax resist, bubble painting, masking, slip trailing, sgraffito, flicking, sponging, using oxides for antiquing, and others. Students will make slab tiles and bowls out of slump molds to practice the techniques. Handouts will be provided that they can use for practice. These designs will cover circlebased, straight-line, square, dot and ball combinations as well as floral and leaf motifs. We will also touch on how to make stencils with the Cricut machine for use on pottery. Pottery beginners are welcome. The hand building done in class is very basic. Class will learn the techniques on tiles and slump and hump molds. More advanced students can bring in their wheel pieces if they so desire. For painting, all levels welcome but a general knowledge of painting and brush work is ideal. Ages 17 and up.

CL640 Mastering Porcelain Paper-Clay

They continue on through youth art classes to the specialized Teen classes and up to the Adult offerings. Overall, it's like a multi-multi- generational family that continues to complete the circle!

REGISTRATION POLICIES

To maintain the high quality of our programs, we require a minimum number of enrolled students. Therefore, the following policies are in place and must be followed.

Enrollment is limited and spaces are filled on a "first-paid, first-served" basis.

Students are responsible for obtaining and providing materials for classes unless otherwise indicated. Materials lists for all classes and workshops will be posted online at www.dfac.org or available directly from the instructor by request. Please make sure your contact information is correct before signing up for a class. All communications will come through the info we have on file.

Classes: Although, we offer specific programming especially for teens, students 17 years and up are eligible to take most adult classes. Session dates are posted in the online catalog and print catalog. Any fees due to an instructor are due the first day of the course.

Workshops: Workshops are offered for those who are unable to commit to a weekly class. They typically are offered on a 1/2-day, full day, 2-day or week-long basis. Tuition covers the cost of instruction for a specified date or dates. Any fees due to an instructor are due the first day of the workshop.

Cancellations, Refunds & Transfers The Dunedin Fine Art Center reserves the right to cancel any class due to low enrollment without incurring obligations. If a class is cancelled, you may transfer to another class or request a full tuition refund. Refunds are only processed during the current session. If a class does not meet the minimum enrollment prior to the start date, it may be cancelled so please register early!

Withdrawals: Withdrawals from any class or workshop must take place one week before the first day of each session. A refund of the tuition less a \$25 administrative fee will be issued. Students withdrawing from any class or workshop after one week before the first day of each session will be issued a refund less the instructor's compensation and the \$25 administrative fee.

Pro-rating: Pro-rating is only available before a session starts and can only be used for 4 or more classes. A \$25 administration fee will apply.

Emergencies: Emergency closing may occur in the event of severe weather conditions.

Make-Up Classes: Make-up classes will be scheduled if a class is cancelled by a DFAC instructor. If a student is unable to attend class for any reason, DFAC is not responsible to provide any additional make-up class or refund.

You will also allow the Dunedin Fine Art Center to take photographs and/or videos of you or your enrolled child/children to be used for DFAC promotional and archival purposes only.


