

2nd LEVEL STUDIOS





We will cover the preparation, use, and care of both straight and oblique dip pens, nibs, and other necessary tools. No experience, training, or artistic skills required. We will also cover preparation of the pieces for glaze firing - including CRYSTALLINE GLAZING. Of course, studio glazes and underglazes are always available. Students may also learn techniques for spraying colors, that are not normally achieved in high-fire oxidation, onto their work. Everyone is welcome to come have fun and create with us. Each week there will be guided demonstrations leading to individual explorations which will help in developing your own artistic voice. By the end of the course, you will not only have a collection of unique pieces but also the skills and confidence to continue exploring this exciting medium. Please note that you will be mixing your own clay which requires moderate hand strength. Ages 17 and up.

Projects will include functional items, bowls, vases, planters and ceramic flowers. Learn to dart, gusset and alter your creations. Bring your imagination and ideas to class and I will help you make them a reality! Ages 17 and up.

CL126 Beginning Clay Handbuilding

In this introductory class we will be exploring all the possibilities for clay handbuilding. Each week will be a new project with a different technique to help you build on your skills. You will learn to use hump and slump molds, coil, extruder and slab building. With these techniques we will make plates, bowls, mugs, boxes and containers with lids, as well as non-funtional decorative pieces. Lastly you will be learning how to glaze with our studio glazes and use of underglaze. We will also explore other firing techniques such as Raku and Obvara. Ages 17 and up.





CL134 Beginning Hand Building

Offered: Winter I, Winter II, Spring

This class was designed for beginners and students with some experience with clay. Students will learn the fundamental techniques of hand building, including coiling, pinching, and slab construction, to create sculptural vessels. They'll explore how to manipulate clay to achieve organic forms, textures, and detailed surfaces, while gaining a deeper understanding of balance, proportion, and the interplay of form and function. Additionally, students will be introduced to surface decoration techniques such as carving, glazing, and underglazing. By the end of the course, students will not only have developed their technical skills but also their ability to express themselves through ceramics, creating unique, sculptural pieces with personal meaning.

DR404 Colored Pencil for Everyone



REGISTRATION POLICIES

To maintain the high quality of our programs, we require a minimum number of enrolled students. Therefore, the following policies are in place and must be followed.

Enrollment is limited and spaces are filled on a "first-paid, first-served" basis.

Students are responsible for obtaining and providing materials for classes unless otherwise indicated. Materials lists for all classes and workshops will be posted online at www.dfac.org or available directly from the instructor by request. Please make sure your contact information is correct before signing up for a class. All communications will come through the info we have on file.

Classes: Although, we offer specific programming especially for teens, students 17 years and up are eligible to take most adult classes. Session dates are posted in the online catalog and print catalog. Any fees due to an instructor are due the first day of the course.

Workshops: Workshops are offered for those who are unable to commit to a weekly class. They typically are offered on a 1/2-day, full day, 2-day or week-long basis. Tuition covers the cost of instruction for a specified date or dates. Any fees due to an instructor are due the first day of the workshop.

Cancellations, Refunds & Transfers: The Dunedin Fine Art Center reserves the right to cancel any class due to low enrollment without incurring obligations. If a class is cancelled, you may transfer to another class or request a full tuition refund. Refunds are only processed during the current session. If a class does not meet the minimum enrollment prior to the start date, it may be cancelled so please register early!

Withdrawals: Withdrawals from any class or workshop must take place one week before the first day of each session. A refund of the tuition less a \$25 administrative fee will be issued. Students withdrawing from any class or workshop after one week before the first day of each session will be issued a refund less the instructor's compensation and the \$25 administrative fee.

Pro-rating: Pro-rating is only available before a session starts and can only be used for 4 or more classes. A \$25 administration fee will apply.

Emergencies: Emergency closing may occur in the event of severe weather conditions.

Make-Up Classes: Make-up classes will be scheduled if a class is cancelled by a DFAC instructor. If a student is unable to attend class for any reason, DFAC is not responsible to provide any additional make-up class or refund.

RELEASES

By registering for a class or workshop, you release the Dunedin Fine Art Center or any person or persons acting on its behalf from liability for any bodily injuries sustained, or for loss or damage of any personal articles while on the premises or while participating in any activity sponsored by the Dunedin Fine Art Center.
